





- Trees trimmed, and ground work completed at the Canine Club.
- Large Pine Tree infested with Pine Weevil removed from Garden of Five Senses.
- Landscape and prep for mulch completed at Morgan and Mullen Center.
- Prepped Myakkahatchee Creek Greenway for Make a Difference Day.
- Palmettos around Scout House cleaned and trimmed.
- Boundless Adventures Gateway Sign installed.

Project Status Design update kick- off meeting scheduled for mid-February Myakkahatchee Creek Greenway Trail Myakkahatchee Creek Greenway Approximately 50 properties remain to be purchased; requisition entered for Land Acquisition acquisition services. Blue Ridge Park Parking Lot SWFWMD permit approval received, construction plan updates underway to Improvements incorporate SDR comments, a construction bid will be advertised upon completion of the plans. **Boundless Playground** Completing punch list items, archway sign installed, project nearing completion. Phase II CDBG project in progress. Community Education Center SWFWMD permit approval received, construction plans update underway to Parking Lot Improvements incorporate SDR comments, a construction bid will be advertised upon completion of the plans. Disc Golf Volunteer clean-up day to begin clearing of invasive vegetation and overgrowth completed on January 12. Working with Public Works to identify plan for additional path improvements. Additional volunteer cleanup day being planned. North Port Aquatic Center Construction underway. Parking lot design awaiting SDR comments. Warm Mineral Springs Park Stakeholder meetings complete, historic designation application submitted, and Master Plan draft master plan development underway. A workshop for the conceptual master plan was held on January 7, 2019. Updated documents per Commission updates underway. **Butler Park Playground** RFP submitted to purchasing for review and scheduling. Replacement MCEP Restroom Replacement Scope for purchase of restroom and installation being completed with Purchasing.
